Learn something new in our woods!



Common Privet—This species was once commonly used for hedging in Elizabethan gardens.

Pin-Oak—Native American tribes use the bark from this tree to make a drink that is used to treat intestinal pain.



Red Elm—This tree is also called a Slippery Elm. When cured the wood is good for making fires.



Honeysuckle—The wood from this tree is the active ingredient found in catnip.

Flowering Dogwood—This plant is unable to self-fertilize.



Wild Black Cherry—The fruit from this tree is good for making jam, soda, pies, and ice cream.
