



Zane State Equivalency Guide: Associate's Degree in Nursing

Admission Information

Individuals interested in the Associate Degree Nursing Program must meet selective criteria. Once the criteria has been met and the individual has indicated the quarter the selection committee should review their file, the file is reviewed **after the deadline date for review (see below)**. The Zanesville Campus will admit a select number of students to the program each fall, winter, and spring quarter. Students will be considered for admission after the deadline date until the maximum number is admitted. Admission to nursing at Ohio University Zanesville does not guarantee admission to the nursing program at Ohio University Chillicothe or Ohio University Southern.

Admission to the Associate Degree Nursing Program

1. University Placement exam (COMPASS)- scores of Tier I Quantitative skills, English 151, and a reading score of 80 or above are required. Students may register for the placement exam in the Learning Advancement Center by calling (740) 588-1510 **AFTER** their admission to Ohio University Zanesville has been finalized.
2. The applicant must be a high school graduate or hold a certificate of High School Equivalency (GED).
3. If an applicant is a transfer or current OU student, they must have an established college grade point average of 2.75 or better on a 4.0 scale.
4. The applicant must have completed courses in algebra, biology, and chemistry with a grade of 'C' or better at the high school or college level.
5. The applicant must submit a "Statement of Education and Career Goals" (typed, no more than 500 words)

Application Deadline: Admission to the Associate Degree Nursing Program on the Zanesville Campus takes place each fall, winter, and spring quarter. The deadline to submit all required information for the program is below:

Fall Quarter – April 1

Winter Quarter – September 1

Spring Quarter – December 1

Advanced Placement for Licensed Practical Nurses

Licensed Practical Nurses (LPN's) can receive credit for the first three quarters of nursing by successfully graduating from an approved school of practical nursing and meeting licensure requirements. In addition, the LPN must successfully complete a five credit hour transition course and three credit hour bridge course with a grade of 'C' or better to enter the second year of the Associate Degree Nursing Program. These courses must be completed no sooner than one year prior to admission to the second year of the nursing program. In addition, students must complete the following support courses before entering the second year of the program: BIOS 130, BIOS 131, CHEM 121, and HCFN 128, or transfer equivalent coursework from Zane State. As an LPN you will also have the option of receiving credit for Maternity, Newborn, Women's Health Alterations (Nurs 220) and Child and Adolescent Health Alterations (Nurs 240) by successfully completing the following exam offered by Excelsior College Examinations: Maternal & Child Nursing (#453).
